Guido Tuveri has won several international competitions for his choreography including Beato Angelico (Italy), Rencontre Franco Italienne (Italy), Rencontre Franco Italienne and Franco Belgique (France). His work has been performed by various companies including A.S.M.E.D. Ballet (Italy), L.T.D. Dance Co. (Italy), Extended Dance Co. (NYC), & Holland Show Ballet (Holland). In 1992, he collaborated with the Creach/Koester Dance Co. in developing a piece presented at Saint Mark's Church (NYC). His choreography credits also include Jon De Mol Productions (Holland), as well as National Italian Television. In 1990, he was awarded the Beato Angelico as best performer (Italy). Guido is co-founder of and choreographer for SNCDC, a modern company founded in NYC in 1993. Since 1988, Guido Tuveri has been teaching his own modern based technique throughout Europe, Canada, the U.S., India, and at present is a faculty member at Ballet Arts at City Center and Steps Studio in NYC.

Jean-Hugues (Jacky) Miredin was born in Martinique (French West Indies) and began his dance studies in Paris. He came to NY in 1988 in search of new inspirations. Since 1991, Jean-Hugues has choreographed for different international competitions including Monte Carlo, Voyron (France). In 1994, he was invited to perform his work in the Downtown Dance Festival (WTC). Jean-Hugues has been a guest teacher in the U.S., Japan, Canada, and Europe. He is a founding member of SNCDC.

Steven E. Brown began dancing in 1988 in Atlanta, GA, and continued as part of the certificate program at Alvin Ailey American Dance Center. He is currently working as a graphics artist and dancer in NYC.

Stephane Boko was born on March 21, 1971 and is from Marseille, France. His classical training began at the Opera de Marseille. His professional career began in 1987 when he joined the corps of the Opera de Toulon, France. A year later, he moved to Paris where he worked with various companies for the next three years. His other experiences include various projects with French and Spanish television. In NYC, he has performed with Cecilia Marta Company, Guido Tuveri, Charlotta Ofverholm, Footprints Company, Catanach Ballet, Decadance Company (Daniel Tinazzi). He has also performed as a soloist in Danny Hermann's rock musical in Germany.

Eric Butler, originally from Pennsylvania, has lived and danced in NYC for the past four years.

Eleanor Hahn received her B.A. in Comparative Literature and her MBA, both from University of California, Berkeley. She began her dance career after moving to NYC in 1992. This is her second year with SNCDC, and her second NYC performance with Teri Lee Steele. Her performance is dedicated to Guido and , as always, to Darin.

Haru Higuchi was born in Osaka City, Japan. He began his dance training at Mariko Dance Theater in Kyoto and came to NYC in 1993. He is currently working with Michael Mao Dance and studying with Guido Tuveri.

Jenny Jacobsson is a native of Sweden where she started what she is hoping will be a long and productive career as a dancer. Even though she has performed in several modern and commercial productions, she feels strongly that she didn't start dancing until she met Guido. She has been with SNCDC since February 1994.

Sita Mani began her career with the Shiamak Davar Dance Co. in India as a dancer and choreographer's assistant. Since receiving her certificate at Alvin Ailey American Dance Center she has worked with Christina Sears & Company Piedo, Uttara Coorlawalla, Katrina Van Zee, and is currently a member of SNCDC.

Letizia Massari was born in Italy where she began her dance studies. She performed with several modern companies in Italy and came to NYC in 1994. She's studying with Guido Tuveri and Jacky Miredin. She would like to thank them for the opportunity to perform with SNCDC.

Charlotta Ofverholm, from Sweden, is a graduate of UCLA in Film/TV/Video and a former actress of The Strasbourg Group. She has danced with choreographers and companies such as Bill T. Jones, Dwight Rhoden/Desmond Richardson, Footprints, Carolyn Carlson, Jorma Uotinen, and Donald McKayle.
